# Introduction

I have been buying and selling on eBay for over 7 years now. A little while ago I discovered a way to make money when other people misspell their auction item titles.


It's actually very simple to making money using this method, you just have to know how to find the items.

See here's what happens, someone will misspell their item title, making it hard for the average person looking for that item to find it.

What does that mean for you? Well a couple of things. That means the person that misspelled their item will either have no bids, or very few, because no one can find them. So this is where you buy it, and you can either keep it for yourself or flip it for a profit!


## Here's an example:

As you can see, the word "Webkinz" is misspelled, the auction is about to end at the price of \$25.

Pretty easy concept to understand, you purchase the item with the misspelled title, and just re-list it with the correct spelling, making you an INSTANT profit! In this case about a \$65 dollar profit was made, using this very simple technique.

## How to use it:


You type in the correct spelling of the keyword your looking for, and it will pull up all the misspelled version of it. Here is an example: [diamond](#).

## Here's another example

This person misspelled the word "playstation". His item is about to end at the bid amount of \$160, these things usually sell for about \$480, a \$320 difference!

brand new playstaion 3 ← Notice the misspelling? Its costing the seller HUNDREDS of dollars. (Average sell price is about \$480)

If you purchase it at the price of \$160 and turn around and sell it with the correct spelling, you could potentially make a profit of about **\$320!**

## My personal experience

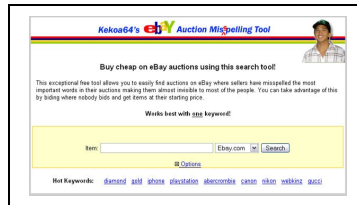
In the past, I would find a product with the misspelled word, win it for a fraction of what it usually cost. Then I would wait for it to come in the mail. When the product arrived I would inspect it to make sure everything as described was there, then I would re-tape it, and re-list it on ebay, using the same box/package that it came in.

I have done this many times and have made and will continue to make, thousands of dollars!

## Conclusion

There are 14 million items listed on ebay at any given time, THOUSANDS of which are misspelled. It's your turn to get a piece of the misspelled auction item pie, and make money in the process.
